The November meeting of the NVC Utilities Trustees convened at 1:05 Utilities chair, Jeffrey Wilt called the meeting to order.

#### **Approval of minutes:**

<u>David moved (Judy second) approval of minutes of October 8, 2023, minutes. The motion was unanimously adopted.</u>

#### **Superintendent Report:**

#### During the October operating period there were no exceedances.

Moore's Septage pumped sludge on 10/6/23.

BOD concentration dropped after pumping

Sodium Hypo tank has been repaired and is currently being tested

We have received a Letter of Warning from DEP (see attached). The letter is in reference to "chronic disinfection and soluble BOD issue." In general, the letter repeats information we have provided DEP. It also recognizes our efforts in address these issues.

Bill Paige has installed both of the new hydrants (Shore Road and Upper Bluff Road) and has been removing water meters for the season.

Discussion on updating water meters:

- Meters are over 25 years old. Ten-year calibration is required
- Researching wireless system. Read meters from a vehicle. The system stores info in the cloud.
- Fully automated. Now 2-3 weeks to read meters. New system will take less than 30 minutes to read all meters. Belfast just changed to wireless system.
- Total cost of system is \$100,000.
- Invite salesperson in December meeting
- Finance options for new system could include one-time charge to users, borrow funds, use reserves or some combination of all three.

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November 10, 2023, Minutes

With a rate increase required to meet budget needs in consideration of 30% increase in the cost of water purchased from Belfast (effective January 1, 2024), financing new water meters and increased personnel expense, the Trustees discussed the *Maine Water Assistance Program* is an income-based program and households seeking assistance with paying their *water* and/or wastewater bills.

#### **Budget Process:**

- Trustees discussed draft Sewer and Water budgets.
- Adopt budgets in December

We have received an Audit letter from Maine Municipal Bond Bank (attached).

#### **Executive Session:**

At 2:30 the trustees went into executive session to discuss a legal issue.

#### LETTER OF WARNING

RE: Letter of Warning (LOW) for chronic disinfection and soluble BOD issues.

#### Dear Chuck:

You are receiving this LOW as a result of a series of bacteria and BOD violations that occurred during the months of July, August, and September:

-	07/06	Daily maximum Enterococci	>2420 CFU/100ml on a 54 CFU limit
-	07/31	Monthly geomean Enterococci	14 CFU/100ml on an 08 limit
	08/08	Daily maximum Enterococci	>9680 CFU/100ml on a 54 CFU limit
-	08/31	Monthly geomean Enterococci	19 CFU/100ml on an 08 limit
	08/31	Monthly average BOD	298 mg/l on a 203 limit
*	08/31	Monthly BOD percent removal	-3% on a 30% limit

	09/30	Monthly BOD percent removal	-14% on a 30% limit

These are violations of Special Condition B.1. of your facility's Waste Discharge License (WDL) #W002575-6B-E-R and Maine Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (MPDES) Permit #ME0100901.

The Department is aware that you pumped out your three treatment trains' primary settling tanks on June 23rd and October 6th of this year, and that during that entire time you ran all three trains in parallel, which should have maximized your treatment potential.
